It is a charitable act that costs nothing but gives the donor an immense contentment of extending someone's life by donating an organ

Organ Donation Day || 13th August

Organ Donation - A Gift for Life

On 13th of August every year, India celebrates Organ Donation Day to motivate everyone to pledge for organ donation and to understand its value for an individual waiting for a second chance of life. It is a charitable act that costs nothing but gives the donor an immense contentment of extending someone's life by donating an organ.

Did you know every year in India nearly-

- 500,000 people die because of non-availability of organs
- 200,000 people die of liver disease
- 50,000 people die from heart disease
- 250,000 people await a kidney transplant but only 5,000 get one
- 1,000,000 people suffer from corneal blindness and await transplant

A donor can save more than 8 lives by donating his/her well-functioning organs. The organs which can be successfully transplanted are kidneys, liver, bone marrow, heart, lung, cornea, and pancreas. Kidneys are often donated from living donors as a healthy person can lead a normal life with only one kidney.

Liver - The donor's blood type should match that of the recipient. A donor, live or deceased, undergoes testing to check if their liver is healthy enough.

Bone Marrow - Only a live donor can donate bone marrow. A donor should have similar genetic makeup to that of recipient. It is stem cell transplant which is done as a part of treatment for cancer if the patient has undergone high dose of chemotherapy, which destroys normal cells in the bone marrow.

Heart - Heart transplantation is a surgical process of replacing the diseased heart with the healthy one. Heart should be transplanted within 24 hours of death. In some cases a live donor can also donate their heart.

Lungs - Donor lungs can be retrieved either from deceased or living one. The living one can only donate a lung lobes.

Cornea - Unlike in other donations, age and blood type are not important in determining the eye donor. However, haematological malignancies, transmissible neuro-pathological diseased people cannot donate.

Pancreas - It is done on people with type 1 diabetes to get new source of insulin from the potential donor. Although it is possible for a living donor to donate a pancreas segment, most pancreas transplant involve a whole organ from a deceased donor.

DON'T TAKE YOUR ORGANS TO HEAVEN; HEAVEN KNOWS WE NEED THEM HERE. Each year thousands of people die while waiting for a transplant, because no suitable donor can be found for them. The demand for organs significantly surpasses the number of donors everywhere in the world. There are more potential recipients an organ donation waiting lists than organ donors. The year 2013 has been the best yet for deceased organ donation in India. A total of 845 organs were retrieved from 310 multi-organ donors (heart donors 25, lung donors 21, liver 257, kidney 548) resulting in a national organ donation rate of 0.26 per million population.

WE MAKE A LIVING BY WHAT WE GET, BUT WE MAKE A LIFE BY WHAT WE GIVE...

To serve this purpose the committee planned to visit **ASHIRWAD VRIDASHRAM**- an old age home in Dhayari, Pune on 11th August, 2015 to offer generously some commodities based on their needs. Comprising of a total of 16 members currently residing in NGO it also provides shelter to three adopted children aged between 14-16 yrs.

Headed by our honourable Director **Prof. Sunil Patil**, a team comprising of 8 members took off at 2 pm to pay a visit to the NGO. On our arrival we received a warm welcome by Mr Vikas Dedge and his wife, the sole care taker of the NGO. Vibrant *rangoli* designs were beautifully portrayed as a symbol of amicable greetings by the NGO people. After this we met all the people there and had a small introduction session followed by which we were offered tea and refreshments specially made for their guests with tremendous blessings and love. Spending time with them was blissful getting to know their vivid aspirations from life and sharing a piece of mind. Adding to this we organised a solo singing round where everyone enjoyed to their heart's content. Mr More, the owner of Goodwill India Foundation (providing necessary things like clothes, food etc to the needy) was invited by Mr Dedge further giving respect to our Director Sir's presence. As a token of gratitude we were embraced by floral bouquets and a *Tilak* portraying the picture of our culture. They got extremely overwhelmed on receiving the donation made by S.P.A.R.S.H. 11 ANTI-RAGGING AWARENESS

Anti-ragging is strictly followed at SITM, SIU and its measure are enforced by the university.

We have sensitization programs during Induction and later to sensitise. There is a group allocated to a Sr. Student to take care of about 8 to 12 students as his mentee together with the faculty assigned.

Awareness is during Induction, later in the year with the mentors. The escalation matrix is explained and the helpline numbers displayed.

The SIU circulars and Norms are the Students affairs website. Amongst the statutory committee this is one of the committees called the Anti-Ragging Committee. At the local level also, there is institution-based committee.

Meaning

Ragging is any disorderly conduct whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness to any student, indulging in rowdy or undisciplined activities which cause or likely to cause annoyance, hardship or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in a fresher or a junior student and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame or embarrassment so as to adversely effect the psyche of a fresher or a junior student.”

Dear Sir/Madam,

In pursuance to the Judgment of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India dated 8.5.2009 in Civil Appeal No. 887/2009, the UGC notified "Regulations on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions, 2009". The Regulations are available on the UGC website i.e. www.ugc.ac.in.

It is once again brought to your kind notice that ragging is a criminal offence and UGC has framed regulations on curbing the menace of ragging in higher educational institutions in order to prohibit, prevent and eliminate the scourge of ragging. These regulations are mandatory and all institutions are required to take necessary steps for its implementation in toto including the monitoring mechanism and any violence of these regulations will be viewed seriously. If any institution fails to take adequate steps to prevent ragging or does not act in accordance with these Regulations or fails to punish perpetrators of incidents of ragging suitably, it will attract punitive action against itself by the UGC.

You are requested to step up anti-ragging mechanism by way of adequate publicity through various mediums; constitution of anti-ragging committee and anti ragging squad, setting up of Anti Ragging Cell, installing CCTV cameras at vital points, Anti- Ragging workshops, updating all websites with nodal officers complete details, alarm bells etc. Regular interaction and counseling with the students, identification of trouble-triggers and mention of Anti-ragging warning in the institution's prospectus and information booklets/brochures shall be ensured. Surprise inspection of hostels, students accommodation, canteens, rest cum recreational rooms, toilets, bus-stands and any other measure which would augur well in preventing/quelling ragging and any uncalled for behavior/incident shall be undertaken.

You are requested to hold the workshops, seminar on eradication of ragging in higher educational institutions and are requested to display Anti Ragging posters at all prominent places like Admission Centre, Departments, Library, Canteen, Hostel, Common facilities etc. The size of posters should be 8X6 feet.

You are requested to get your institution accredited by NAAC/NBA and submit the compliance report and implement the special Drive on anti-Ragging prevention programme.

You are requested to immediately instruct all the colleges under your purview to submit online compliance of anti-ragging Regulations on curbing the menace of ragging in higher educational institutions, 2009 at www.antiragging.in
